The exhibit sound upgrades made possible through the grant from the John Crain Kunkle Foundation, will minimize sound overlap between galleries and enhancing the visitor experience. PAVL was selected to install the necessary upgrades and will be onsite until the work is complete.

It is the largest Civil War museum that addresses the war from both the Northern and Southern perspective, and from both a military and civilian perspective. The Museum protects some of the nation's treasures, including General Robert E. Lee's personal Bible, and more than 24,000 artifacts, documents and photos.
