| <p>Patrick R. Falci is the President of The Civil War Round Table of New York, Inc. Mr. Falci has been involved with the productions of the film <i>Gettysburg</i>, directed by Ronald Maxwell, and <i>Gods and Generals</i>. In <i>Gettysburg</i>, he served as Director/Screenwriter Ronald Maxwell's historical advisor and portrayed General A.P. Hill in the film. For <i>Gods and Generals</i>, he served as Ronald Maxwell's historical coordinator and on set, he provided the directors, actors and costume department with historical information. Mr. Falci has also been involved in the preliminary research of Jeff Shaara's <u>Civil War Battlefields</u> and served as that author's historical advisor for <i>Gods and Generals</i> and <i>The Last Full Measure</i>. He routinely lectures at Civil War Round Tables, historical organizations and schools across the country. Mr. Falci is the recipient of numerous awards, including the CWRT of NY Distinguished Service Award in 1992 and the Ft. A.P. Hill Commander's Award for Excellence in 2000 and 2005.</p> <p>The Civil War Round Table of New York, Inc. ("<u>CWRT of NY</u>") was organized in 1951. In 2001, the CWRT of NY celebrated its 50th anniversary, making it one of the oldest round tables dedicated to the study of America's Civil War. Members include reporters, historians, professors, military personnel and many others. Meetings often include expert speakers addressing a wide variety of Civil War-related topics and frequent updates about preservation strategies of various battlefields and other historic sites. Past speakers have included Ken Burns, James I. Robertson, James McPherson, Shelby Foote and Doris Kearns Goodwin.</p> <p>The CWRT of NY Barondess/Lincoln Award is presented each February to any person or institution for any contribution to the greater appreciation of the life and works of Abraham Lincoln.
