Motts present “The Wounded Soon Began To Pour In...: The George Spangler Farm and the Union 11th Corps Hospital at Gettysburg,” Saturday, February 24, 2018, 1:00 pm - 2:00 pm. Wayne Motts will take you back 155 years to the scene of Gettysburg’s best preserved and documented field hospital. His presentation will include unpublished, rare, and seldom scene material associated with the farm and its history.
